




The Royal School of Yoga Mondays at 1pm

Craftsman Corner

COLD WEATHER PREPARATION/TIPS

Brrr!!! Cold temperatures are upon us and it'll only start to get colder as we enter the early months of the New Year. Please take the time to review this information and share with all.

All windows need to be closed and locked. Often times the top part of the window is overlooked and is open a few inches letting cool air inside.

Keep all doors including closets, pantry and garage door closed and locked.

If your window or screen door is equipped with storm windows please close it.

Set the thermostat to heat the house to 70-72F degrees. Always have the thermostat Fan set to AUTO.

Keep curtains and blinds Open during day to let sunlight in; Keep curtains and blinds Closed at night to keep cold air out.

Check around windows and door frames for cracks or leaks where cold air could be seeping in. Report any deficiencies by sending a detailed Property Work Order Request.

Any "no heat" issues should be reported immediately. Follow the Emergency Procedure you've been provided. The EP can also be found at the bottom of the Property Work Order Request form.

Never use a stove or oven to heat the building.

Alternative heating devices such as space heaters, oil lamps, kerosene heaters, pellet stoves, candles, etc are <u>Not</u> permitted for use in Arc group homes, training centers and apartments.

Stay inside if you can! Do not travel if not necessary. Wear the appropriate amount of clothing (layers, hat, gloves, boots, scarf, winter jacket) if traveling outdoors to help prevent the loss of body heat. Keep hydrated with water as you may become de-hydrated in severely cold weather.

Never leave a consumer unattended.


