The Arc of Somerset County celebrated their 42nd Arc Angel Gala "Celebrating Volunteerism" on Friday, Nov. 14, at Fiddler's Elbow Country Club in Bedminster.

The evening began with Assemblyman Jack Citarelli who recognized three Somerset County High School students who were honored with the "The Angels Among Us" award, which celebrates the volunteer accomplishments of high school seniors who make a difference in the lives of people with disabilities.

Among the three recipients were Leanna Caswell, a senior at Watchung Hills Regional High School in Warren who was honored for her active role in the High School's Peer Outreach elective course, where mainstream students work collectively with their special needs peers on a daily basis, as well as her work as a special needs swim instructor.

Laura Clarke, also a student of Watchung Hills Regional High School was awarded for her over 250 volunteer hours at a preschool and as a therapeutic equine instructor for students with special needs.

Laura Cavanaugh, a senior at Immaculata High School was honored for successfully exceeded more than 1,000 hours of volunteer service working with HAPHA (Higher Achievement Programs for Handicapped Adults) and many other smaller groups that serve the special needs community.

"It is such an honor to have these three High School students receive this recognition for their volunteer work with the special needs community in our county", says Lauren Panarella, executive director of The Arc of Somerset County. "It is The Arc of Somerset County's hope that through public recognition of their efforts, these students will be further inspired to incorporate the spirit of volunteerism into their evolving personal and professional lives."
